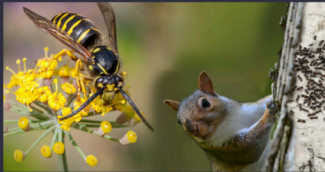

Vicar's letter . . .

Dear Friends,

Easter is one of those times of year when we begin to feel differently about things. We are emerging from the cold and gloom of winter and enjoying brighter days, increased sunshine and warmth; and colour has re-entered our world bringing signs of life all around. It really is an exciting time of year as we see dormancy shed aside and exuberant life beginning again.

As part of our Lent studies this year, the church has been following a new book, called 'Wardrobes and Rings'. It uses the imagery and stories of CS Lewis and JRR Tolkien to draw parallels with the Christian faith and journey, through the barren days of Lent towards the glory of Easter.

I confess to being a Tolkien fan but it has been Lewis, with the door in the wardrobe to a whole new world (Narnia) which has captured my imagination. I have wondered again, what does Easter really mean to me? For many it will be time off work, family gatherings, richer food, plenty of chocolate and some rest, but is that all? Surely there should be a greater depth of meaning to the primary religious festival of the year?

Easter celebrates the opening of a different kind of door but one that also offers entry to a new world. It is through the life of Jesus that we hear about the possibility of relationship with God; through his death on the cross that the punishment for wrongdoing is paid; and by his resurrection that the door is finally opened and we may go in. We go into a new way of life, with new hope and perspective, new trust and faith and the prospect of having a personal relationship with God.

This renewal of our soul brings us life. We blossom and flourish, winter turns to spring, the cold turns to warmth and hearts of stone become living beings once more. We become the people that God would have us be: the message of Easter is truly life-changing.

I pray that you would find joy in the gift from God of new life: Happy Easter!

Meet Sidney Worthington



I was born in Warwick in 1941, the son of a local GP who was the fourth generation of a line of doctors dating back to the latter part of the 18th century, who all trained at Guy's Hospital. The following year my father joined the Royal Army Medical Corps and was posted to North Africa. My mother, older sister and I went to live with my maternal grandparents in north Devon for the duration of the war. My father was demobbed in June 1946 and resumed practice.

I left Rugby in December 1959 having gained entry to Clare College, Cambridge (my great-grandfather had been a benefactor!) to do my pre-clinical studies. I decided that I was too small to play rugby any more so switched to hockey and played in the college first XI. In my final term I was persuaded to take to the water as cox to the "medical eight".

Guy's Hospital beckoned and I applied and spent the night before my interview staying with the physician emeritus, Sir John Conybeare, who had been my father's registrar so I was fairly certain I would be accepted. Three years later, on passing my exams, I started to begin the process of becoming a GP. My first appointment was in General Medicine and Infectious Diseases at Hither Green Hospital in South London as a house physician, where I met my future wife, Pat, who inevitably was a nurse, having qualified as a sick children's nurse in Dublin. After my initial six months I was asked to stay on as Senior House Officer, at the end of which I contracted Glandular Fever and was incarcerated in the hospital for a week or so. Much to the ward sister's annoyance I refused to use a bedpan! My next appointment was General Surgery at the Kent and Sussex Hospital, Tunbridge Wells, and then Obstetrics at the North Middlesex. I had always had an interest in Paediatrics and so moved to Queen Mary's Hospital, Carshalton where I stayed for a year. It was there that I watched the first moon landing. I managed to gain postgraduate diplomas in Obstetrics & Gynaecology and Paediatrics. My oral exam for Paediatrics was easy as, on entering the room, there were six children, all of whom were from Queen Mary's, and I knew them all by name.

My next appointment was for a year as a trainee in General Practice in Merton in London. Pat and I were married in Dublin in September 1970 and honeymooned in Amalfi in Italy. Time seemed to fly and it was soon time to look for a partnership. I saw an advert in the BMJ for a practice in Womersley but it only had an address and no telephone number. There was a postal strike at the time, but luckily one of my trainer's partners knew the father of Ian Hatrick and I was able to phone and ask for an interview. The rest is history, and I joined the practice in April 1971 when it was still located in the annexe to the house where we now live. Graham Hornett, Ian and I looked after about 6,000 patients, 24 hours a day, 52 weeks of the year. The 'new' surgery was already being built, and in 1972 we moved in.

Pat and I have three children - Charles, Sarah Jane and George - all born in Mount Alvernia, Guildford. Our first house was in Chinthurst Park, Shalford, which we bought for £14,000! In 1982 we moved to Mulberry Cottage, which we bought from Dr Gerald Paterson who had been living there for some years. Graham and I decided to retire in 2006 and so a long association with the local population came to an end, although I still get recognised in the village by some of my old patients.

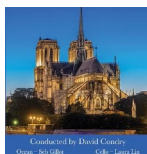

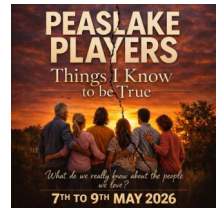

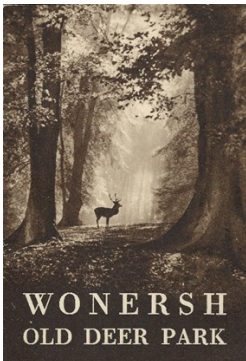

Wonersh Old Deer Park

The land on the edge of Wonersh, today known as Wonersh Park, The Close and Linersh Wood, was originally part of the Wonersh estates of the Norton family (later the Barons Grantley) who had lived in Wonersh for just short of 150 years. Adjacent to Wonersh Mansion and gardens, which had been the home of the Grantleys and their predecessors, had been a substantial Deer Park, which had accommodated a herd of around two hundred deer.



The 5th Lord Grantley decided to auction his Surrey estates in the 1880s and move the family seat back to Yorkshire from whence they came. The Mansion and surrounding land, including the extensive Deer Park, was acquired and owned by the Sudbury family until 1925, when it was bought by Robert Haslam, the then owner of Wonersh Mill and Mill House. Mr Haslam attempted to sell the rather run-down Mansion, without success, and so subsequently had it demolished in 1929. Timber from the Mansion and tiles from its ice-house were donated to Wonersh Parish Council as a bus stop – better known now as the Pepper Pot.



In 1935 the land was put up for auction. The part on which the Mansion had stood would later become today's Church Green, while the adjoining land, including the Deer Park, was acquired by the Kingston-based property developer Herbert Gaze, with the aim of creating an up-market estate of executive homes. The image opposite is the front cover of Gaze's promotional booklet advertising the opportunities to buy plots of land and build a home 'in this pleasant place'. The Park boasted its own Nursery from which plants and shrubs could be supplied, along with access to a resident landscape architect. The booklet also proclaimed that 'hard tennis courts and a pavilion have been installed and the

formation of a club is proposed'. In Wonersh Park, building plots were priced at £750 per acre, while in The Close the average plot measuring 55 feet frontage by 180 feet depth would set you back £250.

The aerial image opposite, from a postcard, shows the road layout of Wonersh Park Estate in 1935/6, when the very first houses had begun to appear. However, development of the estate was severely interrupted by WW2, but picked up again in the 1950s. As a general guide to ongoing costs, the booklet advises that electricity cost 1d [⁵/₁₂p] for 2 units; from April 2026, the price-capped cost will be 27.69p per kwh (plus standing charges)!
