Vicar's letter . . .

Dear Friends,

We are fortunate to live in an area of such beauty with glorious hillsides having views stretching over fields of wheat, barley, maize and, increasingly it seems, vineyards. Some crops of course have enjoyed the wet weather better than others, but as autumn is certainly upon us our thoughts turn to the harvest of the 'fruits of the land'.

We should have deep gratitude for all those that rise early to tend to all that they are growing and rearing for our wellbeing and food for the future. Not only that, but the seasonal workers who pick, package and deliver our food before pruning, tending and getting ready for next year's growth. It is a huge operation, of which we only see the tip of the iceberg (and that is not just the lettuce) in the supermarket.

Ever since the world began, Harvest has been a time of rejoicing, celebration and thanksgiving. In chapter 8 of Genesis, the first book of the Bible, we read that *"seedtime and harvest ... will never cease."* There was a festival (known as the Feast of Weeks) dedicated to thanking God for the harvest, and there are numerous references throughout the Bible to being thankful for the food that sustains life.

And God's part in all this? God is caring and providing, as we read in Zechariah – "Ask the Lord for rain in the springtime; it is the Lord who sends the thunderstorms. He gives showers of rain to all people, and plants of the field to everyone." We are also told in Luke that, while we sleep, God is working in the background to ensure our safety and survival – "Consider how the wild flowers grow. They do not labour or spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these."

Let us not take our land for granted but look after what is entrusted to our care. Let us be mindful of the goodness of God in providing the climate and the means for us to be sufficient in food. So too let us be thankful to God for the love showered upon us, and the care and dedication of those who toil to make sure that we are all able to eat and have our fill.


Children and Families Update

Our more specific requests for October are:



St Martin's Murals



130 years ago a woman artist mounted scaffolding in Blackheath to spend two long summers creating a beautiful and unique wall painting scheme. Between 1894 and 1895 Anna Lea Merritt, an Anglo-American artist, painted in the most difficult conditions. Wearing the long restrictive clothing of the time, she turned blank walls into compelling scenes from the Life of Christ creating a work of art. The paintings remain important for two reasons. Firstly, the painting of a monumental mural scheme by a woman

was unprecedented at the time. Secondly, the murals remain well preserved, painted using the waterglass Keim technique resisting damp. It worked! Conservation work in 2011 restored their original delightful colours. Records at the time show the murals were popular and they remain a delightful surprise to modern visitors.

A year earlier Merritt had attracted huge attention with her oil painting 'Love Locked Out' - the first work by a woman artist bought by the Chantrey Bequest (later the Tate Gallery) for the nation. An emotional painting, a naked boy symbolises love separated by death.

Famous metallurgist Sir William Roberts-Austen commissioned Arts and Crafts architect Charles Harrison Townsend to design the Blackheath church, and his wife, Florence, selected Merritt to paint the interior. Merritt was inspired by the soft pale colours of Early Renaissance wall paintings offering religious education and moral guidance. Scenes illustrate specific Christian stories - for example, John the Baptist, above the baptismal font as one enters, offers Christian faith. The Church aims to bring all classes together for worship, so wall painting was the art of the people encouraging villagers to attend services, many for the first time. Merritt intended her murals to aid religious instruction.

In 1890 Merritt moved from fashionable Chelsea to live permanently in Hurstbourne Tarrant, Hampshire. Preparation began in her end-of-garden studio with pencil and chalk studies which still exist. She travelled with the full size cartoons to Blackheath where they were fixed and traced onto the blank walls leaving them ready for painting. For authenticity she used Hurstbourne Tarrant villagers, 'simple rustic folk,' wearing clothes collected on recent trips to Palestine and Egypt with Pre-Raphaelite artist Holman Hunt, as models for her simple, bold compositions. Local builders, carpenters and plasterers were used to build and decorate the church bringing work to the two poor isolated settlements, promoting Christian values of hard work and diligence.

Anna Lea Merritt, largely self-taught, was one of a few commercial, professional women artists challenging society's expectations when women were viewed as amateurs, led by their emotions, lacking the intellectual capabilities to create historical/religious painting. Championing equal access to academy membership and art training she proved her brilliant design capabilities, overcoming obstacles for women artists. We are privileged to be custodians of St Martin's Murals.

Wonersh Cricket Club

2024 has been a season of new beginnings for Wonersh Cricket Club. Many in the Parish will be aware that Martin Maybrey retired as groundsman at the end of 2023, and a celebratory event was held for



him in May to celebrate his service to the Club of over 50 years. The event included a Wonersh XI v Martin Maybrey XI cricket match, with a large number of former players and local residents turning out to play a closely fought match. Close results became a recurring theme across recent matches, with 7 out of 12 matches played in August and September being decided by less than 5 runs. This year has also seen the inauguration of a 2^{nd} XI team, which has been successfully established as a player pathway from the junior teams into the senior sides. Over the season our 1^{st} XI side played 18 matches, winning 6, and finishing a commendable 7^{th} in Division 3 of the Surrey Downs League.

2025 will continue the theme of change, with the national cricketing league structure going through a reorganisation into a national pyramid. The impact on Wonersh is not yet 100% clear, but this could mean that we have a number of new clubs and venues to travel to in future.

Finally, Wonersh will be entering the winter indoor league again; so if anyone is interested in playing social, village cricket, either over the winter or into next year with our 1st XI, 2nd XI, midweek T20 or friendly Sunday teams, do drop an email to **secretary@wonershcc.co.uk**.

Donate a Gate or a Tree Barnett Fields and Healy's Wood

The resident-led Barnett Fields Group (BFG) plans for the newly acquired fields and woods (now known as Healy's Wood) have been agreed in principle by the Parish Council. Thank you to the BFG and of course the Wonersh Environmental Advisory Group (WEAG) of volunteers who will do much of the work. The plans include completing baseline wildlife and plant surveys, paths through the woods, hedging, new trees, new gates and fencing, coppicing and thinning, and dead-hedging. Other options to be evaluated include a pond, orchard and possibly even short term grazing by Highland cattle. Barnett Hill Hotel has agreed to a connecting gate between the hotel and Healy's Wood.

We also plan new signage (sponsored by our Surrey County Councillor) and have received a generous grant from the Wonersh Fair for seating. Most of the funding is expected to come from grants and sponsorship.

Wey & Arun Canal Trust Restoring London's Lost Route to the Sea

The Wey & Arun Canal, completed in 1816, linked the Thames to the English Channel by joining the River Wey Navigation at Shalford to the River Arun Navigation at Newbridge near Pulborough. With the development of the railways the canal became uneconomic and was formally abandoned in 1871, and the land was sold to private individuals.

In 1973, the Wey & Arun Trust was formed with the aim of restoring the canal which runs through 23 miles of the most beautiful Surrey and Sussex countryside. Since then, we have purchased and leased 8 miles of the canal. Some 10 miles of towpath are accessible and the general route of the whole canal can be followed by walkers using the Wey South path.

There are a number of sections of the canal useable by small craft such as kayaks and paddle boards. We have restored 3 miles of the canal at Loxwood where it has an Information Centre and operates 3 Trip Boats. These carry about 10,000 passengers each year on cream tea cruises, private hirings and themed events.

Over the past 50 years, we have restored 11 locks, 24 bridges and 2 aqueducts. We are planning to acquire additional canal land, open further stretches of towpath and extend the lengths of canal which can be used by small craft.

Clearly the restoration of the canal is a long-term project. However, it is opening a green corridor through stunning Surrey and Sussex countryside to wildlife, walkers, small craft and eventually even Narrow Boats.
