

## Prayer Diary - September 2025

Spending time with God in prayer is fundamental to our Christian life and is a means by which we communicate with/hear from our heavenly father and build relationship with God. Below are some suggested prayer topics which are aimed at raising awareness rather than giving instructions. Use these suggestions as a guide but make them your own, in your own way, to build your own relationship.

Monday 1 <sup>st</sup>	As we begin a new month, with <b>the Wonersh Week of Prayer</b> (1st -
	7 <sup>th</sup> ) let us join together to ask God to refresh our faith, renew our
	commitment to prayer and pray that our whole church family may
	seek first the Kingdom of God in all things.
Tuesday 2 <sup>nd</sup>	Please pray for our <b>Meals Ministry programme</b> (run by Clare) and
	the local Foodbanks with whom we are associated, that they will
	have all the resources and skills needed to manage the work well.
Wednesday 3 <sup>rd</sup>	Pray for the <b>children and youth of our parish</b> as they return to
	school. Ask God to give them confidence, friendship, and the
	knowledge of His love day by day.
Thursday 4 <sup>th</sup>	Let us pray for <b>healing and justice</b> in our Church, remembering
	survivors of abuse. May God bring comfort, courage, repentance,
	and renewal.
Friday 5 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for all who are <b>preparing for Sunday services</b> (Clare and Lori
	leading & caring for the children; musicians, readers, sound desk).
	Ask that God would anoint their gifts for His glory and bless this
	family occasion.
Saturday 6 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for those in <b>our community</b> facing financial difficulty.
	Remember local foodbanks and the Meals Ministry, that they may
	be resourced to serve with compassion.
Sunday 7 <sup>th</sup>	As we gather in worship today in our <b>All-Age Service</b> , and the Kids
	work begins again, followed by the <b>'Family Fun Day'</b> in the
	vicarage garden, please pray that everybody will encounter Christ
	afresh and be drawn into His presence.
Monday 8 <sup>th</sup>	Give <b>thanks for volunteers</b> who serve quietly in the background of
	parish life— covering administration, cleaning, gardening, those
	who make tea and coffee. Pray God's blessing upon them.

Tuesday 9 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for <b>Clare Hepworth</b> (Children & Families leader) that God

Thursday 11 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for Nicky and the <b>Open the Book</b> team from Wonersh
	as they bring Bible stories to life in local schools. Pray their first
	presentation today, 11th September will be clear and engaging,
	and that the children will sense God speaking to them.
Friday 12 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for <b>Sunday's services</b> , this month on the theme of
	Generosity & Giving. Ask that God's Spirit move among us, His
	Word be spoken with inspiration, clarity and grace, and give
	thanks for all who help make our worship uplifting and unifying.
Saturday 13 <sup>th</sup>	Heritage Day at Wonersh Church; that many local people will
	become aware not only of the historical importance of the Church
	but the spiritual heritage in our community.
Sunday 14 <sup>th</sup>	Today the Church Calendar invites us to remember the <b>Cross of</b>
	Christ—the supreme sign of God's love and self-giving. In this
	month of generosity, let us thank God for Jesus' faithfulness and
	pray to take up our cross in the way of love.
Monday 15 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for <b>Lori Cook</b> (curate), that God will continue to help her grow
	in her ministry among us and build some great relationships. And
	for <b>Liz Hayley</b> & <b>Jan Durrant</b> recovering from recent surgery.
Tuesday 16 <sup>th</sup>	Great Lakes Outreach, Burundi: Pray for GLO's local leaders
-	bringing hope through education, healthcare, and community
	projects across Burundi. Ask God's blessing on their wisdom,
	integrity, and courage amid poverty and political challenges, and
	for lasting transformation in Jesus' name.
Wednesday 17 <sup>th</sup>	Let us pray for <b>our schools and teachers</b> . Ask God to give them
_	patience, energy, and wisdom as they support children in their
	learning and growth.
Thursday 18 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for <b>healing for those who are sick</b> in body, mind, or spirit,
,	asking God to bring peace, comfort, and strength. Remember
	especially <b>the elderly</b> of our parish, that they may know God's
	presence and be valued in our community.
Friday 19 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Tear Fund</b> : Give thanks for Tearfund's work through local churches
	tackling poverty, injustice, and crises worldwide. Pray for peace in
	conflict zones, strength for their partners, and bold advocacy for a
	fairer, more sustainable world.
Saturday 20 <sup>th</sup>	Pray that our <b>Sunday services</b> may be welcoming and renewing
	for all, and for the teams who help facilitate us being a generous,
	hospitable, worshipping community.
Sunday 21 <sup>st</sup>	St Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist: Today the Church Calendar
	commemorates Matthew, called from being a tax collector to
	follow Christ. Pray for all who feel unworthy or overlooked, that
	they too may hear His call and follow Him.

Pray for those in <b>government and public service</b> , locally and
nationally. Ask God to give them wisdom, courage and personal
integrity to serve with justice and compassion.
Pray for <b>peace in areas of conflict</b> —particularly in Ukraine, where
fighting persists across multiple regions, and in the Middle East
amid escalating tensions in Gaza, the West Bank, and Nablus. Ask
that God's Spirit would move in the hearts of leaders everywhere.
CRANE, Uganda: Thank God for CRANE's network protecting and
empowering children at risk in Uganda. Pray for unity among its
workers, resources for its mission, and that every child may grow
up safe, loved, and able to thrive.
Pray for Jan Durrant (administrator and soon to be curate) as she
prepares for her forthcoming ordination at Guildford Cathedral
next Sunday. Ask that God will continue to grow and guide her
ministry, protect and sustain her family.
Wonersh & Shamley Green Primary School: Give thanks for the
school's nurturing Christian ethos, beautiful setting, and strong
sense of community. Pray that every child may flourish in
confidence, kindness, and creativity, supported by inspired staff
and a vision rooted in God's love.
Pray for our <b>Sunday worship and preaching</b> , that they may inspire
us all to grow as a generous and giving community. Ask God's
blessing on those who lead and serve, that our services may be
uplifting and welcoming to everyone.
Give thanks for <b>our fellowship in Christ</b> , both in church and
online. Pray that all—whether present in person or watching on
YouTube—may feel part of our worship, united in love and mission,
witnessing to the hope we have in Him.
Give heartfelt thanks for our vicar, <b>David Peters</b> , and for the
outstanding support of his wife, <b>Marion</b> . Pray that together they
may know God's guidance and empowerment, protection in the
spiritual battle, and fresh vision and discernment for the ministry
entrusted to them.
YMCA Downslink Group: Thank God for safe homes, counselling,
and care provided to thousands of young people through YMCA
DLG. Pray for vulnerable children and families, especially asylum
seekers in Guildford, that they may find healing, stability, and
hope.
And let us pray for <b>the month ahead</b> . Ask that God would bless all
that has been planted in prayer during September and bring fruit in
His time.
