

Vicar's letter . . .



Dear Friends,

Over the summer, I have had the privilege and joy of meeting our first grandchild, a little girl: the first girl born in our family for over 120 years! Holding this precious bundle as she made small gurgling noises and, over time, started to recognise and reach out, was a reminder of the importance of communication.

We learn, we experience and we relate through our communication: what we see, hear and speak. We communicate with God, both listening and speaking, primarily through what is called prayer. Time and again in the Bible we read of Jesus setting himself apart to pray and, on the eve of his arrest, it was to prayer that he turned.

Prayer is 'being' with God: in silence, in meditation or through making verbal requests and thanksgiving. Prayer is two-way, as we not only say what is on our heart, but listen and sense God's response to our plea.

The first week of September will see an encouragement for prayer across the world, and so we aim to play our part in Wonersh. To make this as available as possible, we will erect a tent outside St John's Church so that anyone can find space, solace, peace and the presence of God at any time, day or night.

As a church we will be committing to pray at various points throughout the day and there will be some subject material and aids to prayer inside the tent. Perhaps you have not prayed before: do not let that put you off. Come to meet God in silence or pour out your heart and soul; seek and find the God of compassion and relationship, who longs to communicate. Children and Families Update



Shalford Mill is possibly best known these days as having been the headquarters of **Ferguson's Gang.** Brynhild Catherine Jervis-Read (Sister Agatha) and Peggy Pollard (Bill Stickers) persuaded the then owner of the mill, the Godwin-Austen trust, to donate it to the National Trust. The Gang was to raise the money for its repair and future running costs. The conservation architect, John Eric Miers Macgregor (the Artichoke), also became a member of the Gang, as did Major Arthur Godwin-Austen (the Pious Yudhishthira). The Gang used the Mill from 1932 until 1966. Much more about the building will be revealed to members of Wonersh History Society by David Hunt at our September meeting.

Wonersh United Reformed Church

In 1860 Great Tangley Manor was operating as a farm occupied by Mr. William Colebrook, a Guildford butcher. He was a non-conformist, and very interested in the welfare of his employees. William invited them to his house one night each week for reading the Scriptures. This was quickly followed by a Sunday evening service in the kitchen at Great Tangley, largely attended by his farm workers, employees of the Unwin printing works at Chilworth, and their families.

The kitchen soon became too small for the numbers attending, so William decided to use one of his barns instead. The place was rough - stools without backs and a dirt floor – but that did not deter people from attending. The Colebrooks, at their own cost, later laid a floor, installed seating and lamps, and the congregation grew further – particularly of children in Sunday School.

By 1880 it was apparent that the 'Old Barn' was no longer suitable or large enough. To the rescue came William Seth Smith of Little Tangley, who generously gave a piece of his land for the building of a new home for the services. Designed by his architect son Howard, the foundation stone was laid on 21st April 1880. The builder - Goddard and Sons of Farnham & Dorking - used Bargate Stone with Bath stone dressings and, according to a Surrey Advertiser report, the cost was £1,950.

The last service in the Barn was held on Sunday 19th September 1880; the new Church building was opened on 22nd September that year. Proud locals christened it the 'Non-conformist Village Cathedral'. For forty years it continued under the old name of the Tangley Chapel, then it became known as The Wonersh Congregational Church. For just over 100 years the church was a member of the Guildford Group of Congregational Churches, but in 1972, when the Congregational Churches in England & Wales and the Presbyterian Church of England joined to become the United Reformed Church of England & Wales, the Wonersh Church became an independent United Reformed Church.



In July 2025 it was announced that Wonersh United Reformed Church would cease its services and other activities on 19th October 2025, ending 145 years of significant contributions to the community of Wonersh. From its ecumenical work to its close association with Wonersh Scouts; the Summer Fair book stalls; the annual 'Songs of Praise on the Lawn'; carol concerts; the Wednesday Film Nights, and more besides: its closure will leave a gaping hole that will be difficult to fill.

Wonersh Environmental Advisory Group (WEAG)

WEAG includes the smaller Barnett Fields Group (BFG), and now has over 100 members - the passion, enthusiasm and energy is very apparent!

The amount of work done over the last year has been exciting and transformational. The list is endless:

- Healy's Wood is now open with paths, glades, dead hedging, bird boxes, etc.
- The Barnett Fields have mown paths, wild flower areas, reconfigured water troughs, new hedging and solar-powered electric fencing, new trees and more.

The BFG members are having fun learning new skills including the use of chain saws and brush-cutters, fence-post stripping and splitting, as well as scything. The feedback from walkers and dogs is enthusiastic!

None of this happens without the WEAG/BFG volunteers, and residents who have been so generous donating new oak gates and benches. We have also received free trees and grants from the likes of Surrey Wildlife Trust and Surrey Council and, of course, the Wonersh Fair who sponsored the picnic table and the adjacent bench and gate.

We use our own wood from Healy's Wood for kissing gates and deer protection. This timber comes from the thinning of the closely-planted native trees in Healy's Wood, which will be progressively thinned and coppiced over the coming years. This will allow the better trees to mature and encourage biodiversity in the undergrowth, which is currently fairly sterile with little light.

The response from residents to the recent request to sponsor trees has been fantastic. We now have funds for new trees in the Barnett Fields, which will be planted later in the year, along with new hedging also funded by grants. We are also planning replacement trees and other biodiversity projects for the rest of the commons.
