Vicar's letter . . .

Dear Friends,

"Lights, Camera, Action". Many of us over the Christmas season will be sitting down as a family to enjoy a film on the TV or at the cinema. I had a brief experience of the film industry recently as a film crew from Netflix (other channels are available!) came to film a new series in the house opposite where I live.

There were people, cars, trucks and lights everywhere. It was all rather exciting: the stars of the show kept a disappointingly low profile, but we felt as though we were part of the action. Of course, scenes were shot out of order and small snippets only tell part of the story. Much of the 'shoot' was apparently being undertaken in the studio in Shepperton.

It struck me that the Nativity may feel quite similar. We look into the Bible, and we see small but exciting events; we read of amazing healings, miracles, wonderful words of wisdom and teaching, but we tend to look at each as a separate story.

The beauty of film is that these snippets come together to form a complete film, story, documentary or series. Take a moment to step back from the Bible and consider the gospel (the story of Jesus) as a whole. Here is a child, 'born to save'. The birth is wonderful: we make it romantic but, in reality, it was a cold, dirty and inauspicious start to life.

But this life became a pivotal point in the history of humanity. A child, who was God in the form of humanity, was born to teach, to live and demonstrate a life of love. Ultimately he died to save us from all the things we wish we had never done. This is love in motion picture. This Christmas, take some time out to look at the whole story. You are welcome to start by joining us for one of our many services over the Christmas period.

More from Clare Hepworth

In my role as Children and Families leader, it's the greatest of privileges to journey alongside so many families with young children in our community.

The pressures on today's parents are many and can cause doubt, anxiety and over-thinking. There's so much 'external chatter' out there on various social media platforms and the internet. Advice is contradictory and convincing in equal measure - and is

spoken with authority even when there's no actual evidence for what is said. Differing parenting styles lead to questioning: how do I want to 'show up' for my child, and how do I manage conflicting expectations?


Between Monday's **Mums, Bumps and Babies**, Thursday's **Chatterbox** and Sunday's **Kids Church**, my wonderful teams and I interact with around 50 different parents each week. It's a joy-filled but also full-on time of their lives, and we love listening, chatting and supporting as they share what's going on in their worlds.

I love Christmas. The Nativity is so much more than a much-loved Bible story because it represents love and compassion, humility and gratitude, inclusivity and acceptance - all values which can shape the way we live as families and our interactions with the world around us. The story can also be a cornerstone for family traditions because, as we tell it each year, we build a sense of continuity and connection, reinforcing the importance of our own family and its unique values.



My favourite part of Christmas is seeing the children getting involved with the retelling of the Nativity and taking away from it the bits that mean the most to them. Jesus loved children, and he didn't ask for them to turn up perfectly prepped and scripted; he wanted them to come to him just as they are. He knew that when a child learns about God, a little seed is sown in their hearts that will always be there. I can still remember as a young child going to Guildford Cathedral each Christmas Day and being drawn to the Nativity scene displayed there. It gave me an overwhelming sense of wonderment that has remained with me.

And what of 2025? Well, I long for more people to hear about the Christian faith and its simple message of God's unconditional love, freely available to us all. I want them to know that God loves us and accepts us no matter how broken or imperfect we may feel, and that all we have to do is ask him into our hearts. I'd love to run a course to explore more about faith for those in our community who are questioning the lack of constancy in their lives, and who are seeking more. I'm also looking forward to seeing how our Kids Church develops, and am excited to see what the year brings.

We are pleased that once again Nick Bale is visiting the Society, this time to present "The Best Resting Place – The Mount Cemetery". Opened in 1856, the cemetery is the site of the graves of Charles Lutwidge Dodgson (Lewis Carroll), his brother Edwin and five of his seven sisters. Others interred there are Henry Peake, Guildford's first Borough Surveyor; the social reformer Edward Carpenter; one-time Canadian Finance Minister, Sir John Rose; and 33 Commonwealth service personnel from the two World Wars. Also within the grounds is Bookers Tower commemorating the premature loss of two sons of Guildford corn merchant, miller and 3-times mayor, Charles Booker. A fascinating talk is in prospect.

We round off the year on 16th December with a Christmas Spectacular for carer guests and their partners, with carols and Christmas festivities in the Arts Centre.




Phyllis Tuckwell Hospice Care
